ADAC GT4 Germany: Egor Litvinenko faces a difficult race at the Sachsenring

Last weekend's ADAC GT4 Germany race was a real test of endurance for Egor Litvinenko (21) from Munich. Together with his British teammate, Egor competed in the Porsche Cayman RS GT4 of the Austrian Wimmer Werk Motorsport team at the Sachsenring.

The Sachsenring is known for its demanding track layout, but the conditions for the young duo could hardly have been more difficult: the team was unable to take part in the originally planned test day before the event, meaning that both drivers started the event without any practice laps. While Egor Litvinenko was at least able to draw on experience from another event with a different car, the track was completely new territory for Oskar Dix.

The difficult circumstances were reflected in qualifying: 21st and 18th on the grid were the best they could manage. But in the race, Litvinenko and Dix showed morale and fighting spirit. Egor in particular impressed in the first race with a spirited performance that took him up to 15th place – a remarkable achievement given the strong and extremely balanced GT4 field.

The second race, however, was less successful. Despite all their efforts, they only managed to finish in 19th place – a result that the duo could not be satisfied with. 'We made the best of the situation, but without a test day and practice, it's extremely difficult here,' Litvinenko summed up after the race.

Looking ahead: Red Bull Ring on 14 September

Team Wimmer Werk Motorsport and its two young talents are now looking ahead. The next stop for the ADAC GT4 Germany is the Red Bull Ring in Austria, where Egor Litvinenko will once again be fighting for valuable points.
