



Difficult Season Opener for Egor Litvinenko in ADAC GT4 Germany

Russian-born racing driver Egor Litvinenko, who lives in Munich, experienced a challenging start to the 2026 ADAC GT4 Germany season last weekend. Together with his British teammate Oskar Dix, Litvinenko competes for Wimmer Werk Motorsport in a Porsche Cayman GT4 RS. The highly competitive championship is regarded as one of the strongest GT4 series in the world and features six race weekends across Germany and Austria.

Ahead of the season, the driver pairing had already attracted considerable attention. During the official ADAC pre-season tests, Litvinenko and Dix delivered consistently strong performances, finishing within the top three in every session. Expectations were therefore high heading into the season opener at the Red Bull Ring.

However, the race weekend did not go according to plan. Due to university commitments in Munich, Litvinenko was unable to participate in the free practice sessions and only arrived at the circuit later on Friday. As a result, teammate Oskar Dix completed the sessions alone, leaving the team without valuable setup work and important data collection opportunities.

Despite these challenges, both drivers delivered solid qualifying performances, securing 12th place on the grid in their respective sessions. In the first race, Litvinenko made a strong start but was soon involved in an incident through no fault of his own. A competitor misjudged a braking maneuver and struck the Porsche from behind. The consequences were significant: a major loss of positions and extensive damage that required the team to work through the night to repair the car.

Unfortunately, the second race on Sunday brought no improvement. Another incident resulted in a further retirement. Despite showing promising pace and demonstrating that the overall package was competitive, the team left the opening weekend without scoring any championship points.

Disappointed but determined, Litvinenko and his team now return to Munich with their focus firmly set on the next race weekend at the Norisring. The goal is clear: to finally convert their evident potential into a top result.

“The speed is there, the team is operating at the highest level — now we just need that little bit of luck to make everything come together.”
